

Debris Removal Guidelines

- **Remove your tree and vegetation debris to the curb side without placing in the roadway. Debris should be placed between the road side and sidewalk. An open road way is essential for emergency response and debris cleanup operations.**
- **Make sure you keep debris away from storm drain inlets as this may result in localized flooding due to blockage of the storm water system.**
- **Make sure you separate vegetation debris from building debris as these cannot be mixed during the removal operation and may impede the ability to cleanup in front of your home.**
- **Do not place debris of any type on or near a fire hydrant. Fire hydrant must remain visible.**
- **Do not place debris of any type on or near mail box. U.S. Postal Service needs access to your mail box.**
- **Do not attempt to burn debris of any type. This is a serious hazard and may result in the spread of fire or dangerous smoke conditions, damage the roadway, or other public or private property.**
- **Be extremely alert of falling trees, leaning trees, or dangerous limbs that may still fall. It is your responsibility to work with a contractor to attend to tree problems on your property. You may wish to consult your insurance carrier on this matter.**
